

No solution

The proposal to install a pissoir in Springfield Plaza (Herald, September 5) is a typically muddled response from South Sydney Council to the complex issues which affect residents of the Kings Cross/Potts Point area.

Problem: undesirables flock to Kings Cross, making life miserable for residents. Solution: build facilities for undesirables; locals still miserable. WRONG! The real solution is to deal with the problem.

Though allegedly a tourist precinct (whatever that means), Kings Cross has no public toilets. The Fitzroy Gardens toilet block is the council's disgrace — a stinking cesspit that is a no-go area to all but the most olfactorily challenged addicts and rent boys.
